The Silver Wattle Quaker Centre was established in 2010 as an Australian Quaker study & retreat centre. In this first decade:



- 🔊 The Silver Wattle property at Bungendore was purchased
- 🔊 Courses, retreats & venue hire use of the property have expanded
- 🔊 An Elders pool to support course staff & volunteers has been established
- & Assets have been improved including a new kitchen, vehicles & water tanks with purification systems
- 🔊 Photovoltaic solar power systems have been installed
- ₺ Energy-efficient heating & cooling has been fitted
- ⊗ A substantial library collection has been developed
- & Orchards & productive food gardens have been rejuvenated
- **&** Degraded land has been extensively revegetated.

The year in review

Silver Wattle's normal business was abruptly halted in early 2020 by the COVID19 pandemic. While 'normalcy' may not be re-established until 2022, the Board has used this time to make improvements & develop a strategy for Silver Wattle 'towards 2030'.

During the year, Silver Wattle:

- Partnered with Australian Yearly Meeting to develop training for online (Zoom) participation in Worship & courses;
- Continued the Wednesday online Meeting for Worship;
- Hosted a Webinar by Paul Buckley, an American Quaker & specialist on William Penn;
- Offered a series of Friday evening online Epilogues attended by registrants from Australia & around the world;
- Initiated the Silver Wattle Elders Enrichment Program (SWEEP)

Making the most of the COVID19 'fallow-time', other work included:

- Commissioning an architect to oversee building an 'Access Unit' to provide disabilityfriendly & energy efficient accommodation;
- Installation of climate controlled systems in the dining, kitchen & office areas;
- Re-covering of the 'tunnels' for vegetable production;
- Re-painting of external wood work;
- Building a stone well & benches adjacent to the lake, arising from the leadings of a generous donor.



Our finances

Despite the drop-off in revenue-raising activity, Silver Wattle remains financially solvent with adequate reserves & reduced costs thanks to a number of changes including the upgrade of Silver Wattle's solar-power capacity.

Silver Wattle income has been sustained by some early NSW & Australian government COVID19 assistance, occasional visitors & retreatants underpinned by the loving generosity of donors & volunteers.



Where to next ...

Our current focus is on supporting future courses & events, improving the Silver Wattle website & social media platforms & finding information technology systems plus people to manage document storage, donations & finances. We have also used this 'fallow' time to search for a new Centre Co-ordinator & to build a resident community.

Towards 2030

The plan towards 2030 will help Silver Wattle move from the establishment phase of the first decade to a consolidation phase in 2020-2030.

With prayerful discernment, the priorities for the next 10 years will be:

- 1. Sharing wisdom & experience to help respond to the promptings of the Spirit, through learning courses, retreats, community life, sharing gifts & connecting with country
- 2. Fostering an accessible, diverse & resilient community
- 3. Care for the land & property entrusted to us
- 4. Developing sustainable human, organisational, technological & financial resources.

This will be a time during which we expect climate change to bite more seriously & Silver Wattle will offer both onsite & online programs.

Sanctuaries have historically withstood the tests of time & turmoil. Retreat centres & monasteries have existed from the subarctic of northern Russia to the chilly windswept coasts of England to sunny Mediterranean lands, in tropical jungles of southeast Asia & in the Egyptian deserts. Silver Wattle will continue to nurture its vision, whatever climate change brings, as a place of spiritual inspiration & transformation.

The new solar panel 'array' nestled on the accommodation wing roof has significantly reduced Silver Wattle energy emissions & costs.
